Currently, the Saturday only program has spiked to 50 participants, many of whom are searching for more meaningful vocational, social and recreational opportunities as a result of a tremendous void in programs for our adult graduates. To ameliorate the impact of this issue, experts like those at the Boston Higashi School have been working diligently to fill the gap in quality service programs for adults with ASD.

To that end, the school has renovated the basement of the Magennis Building to accommodate that demand. Planning has been underway for the past several months to expand CAEP to a weekday program with the Magennis Building serving as its home base. Once furnished, three beautifully renovated rooms, in an area once occupied by EP will soon be ready for business. Stay tuned for updates!

#### **Brady Fitness Center**

The Fitness Center in the Brady basement is being overhauled with new treadmills and stationary bikes. In the works for several months now, the outdated and overused treadmills, ellipticals, stair climbers and bikes will be a thing of the past. We will be calling on all of you for your support as we will soon be announcing drop off stations at the school.

#### **New Health Center**
