# A Season of Growth & Activity

The Residence truly blossoms in Spring and Summer! Despite fluctuating weather, students and staff from Middle School to the Emergence Program enthusiastically engaged in a wide range of activities on and off campus. This season also brought significant changes: 4 residential teachers transitioned to the Day Program, while 4-5 new residential teachers joined our overnight and afternoon teams. Additionally, new residents were welcomed, and 10 students successfully transitioned to their next divisions. Our commitment to putting students first led to a very successful season, even as we continuously strive for improvement.

Our Middle School Division continues to excel, recently celebrating their first one-inning T-Ball game where all students hit and fielded. Students and staff proudly secured baseball shirts, with staff enthusiasm rivaling the students'!

Junior High has made extensive use of the Library, visiting multiple times weekly. Guided by our head librarian, students enjoy pre-set daily stations. Embracing spring, the library transformed into a vibrant bird sanctuary.

The Girls Division has made significant strides in teamwork and rollerblading skills. Managing 13 unique young women presents challenges, but dedicated staff work tirelessly to ensure each girl's individuality shines.

High School A has been a hub of culinary creativity. Their stir-fry activities generated incredible aromas and fostered a competitive spirit among cooking stations, fueled by staff excitement.

High School B dedicated this semester to athletics and vocational skills, crucial for teenagers. Through activities like swimming, cafeteria setup, and cleaning, students gained invaluable life skills, strengthening their independence and self-esteem.

Our Young Adults are preparing for their next chapter, honing vocational opportunities. This spring and summer, they are launching a weekend car wash service, offering practical experience for future careers.

The Emergence Program, our oldest students, focuses on preparing for the world beyond Higashi. Recent months included collaborations with CAEP graduates and active community engagement, such as volunteering at the Randolph Food Pantry, attending the Japan Festival in Boston, and participating in the school's annual Evan's Run, a 5K race honoring a former student.

It is truly a privilege to teach and engage with our students daily at the Residence. As the students continue to grow, we also continue to grow as teachers. For every lesson your child learns from us, we undoubtedly learn three or four in return! Thank you from everyone at the Residence.

#### **Autism Acceptance Month**

The spring season at Higashi was exceptionally busy, marked by a wide array of significant events and initiatives both on and off campus.

During Autism Acceptance Month in April, we were thrilled to spotlight our partnership with New England Disabled Sports. Through this collaboration, a dedicated group at Loon Mountain Resort provided an unforgettable experience for some of our students and their families, offering professional instruction in adaptive skiing.

We were also pleased to feature our Food Pantry, which gained wider recognition through the assistance of Logan Hall at WBZ News. Concurrently, the Teacher's Room underwent a complete renovation, where our community rallied together for our Fund a Desk Campaign in which we are thrilled to share the results: we raised over \$15,000!

Our Jazz Band maintained a highly active schedule, with a notable performance at the Autism Rocks Event, hosted by The Arc of South Shore.

The month concluded with the distinct honor and privilege of welcoming Dr. Temple Grandin, who presented "The Way I See It." 
